

Our Treasurer KA3JAL, John Germain gave the following report:

The repeater fund stands at \$3,264.69 plus interest. Club membership stands at 58 with 4 lifetime and 54 dues paying. We had 29 members at the June meeting with 21 members and 8 guests, 3 of which became members that night.

ARRL SECTION: N4JJ, Jack Jackson was unable to attend but KM4D, Dave Jones reported that nothing much was happening with the ARRL. KO4L, Lloyd Mitchell, who travels all around the country for SC Forestry, noted that the ARRL VEC has been extremely slow with licenses and upgrades and we should be very happy that we have become affiliated with WCARS.

PIO: KA3JAL reported that he had been able to get an article in the

News Journal before Field Day and arranged for a news crew from WBTW-TV to visit Lake Darpo and film our event.

E M E R G E N C Y COMMUNICATIONS:

Hospital Emergency Amateur Radio Team (HEART) has completed two training sessions for 14 hospitals in the DHEC Region 4, which covers most of the local area. This training brought hospital personnel and Amateur Operators together to plan for mutual aid in case of a disaster. Very few of the hospital employees have been licensed so the majority will have to be trained and licensed. One major concern is the development of a system of identification that will allow Amateurs to pass through police and hospital security to man hospital stations. The meetings ended with a simulated traffic net. The Florence HEART VHF and UHF repeaters are not operational but will come on line soon. (These stations went on the air on 7/17/08)

a microphone recently. W4PFZ, Mac McDaniels, reports that a signal holds the repeater up until it times out. It seems to be mechanical and is very-precise with a low level signal near '85 and is most prevalent between 8AM and Noon on certain days. K4AVR, Mac Cullom, noted that on the GE MASTR III, the tone board should be external to the unit. A TS-64 board is available for under \$60 should the club decide to add tone.

97: We were told that due to overloading, the 97 repeater would be removed from the existing emergency generator. That never came to pass and not only is a new generator now on-line, but the grounding system will be upgraded and connected to the building ground. Remember, the original antenna was installed in 1973 and has been replaced twice.

440: This repeater checks out well.

We need to remember to copy the bulletin sent by ARRL and also to invite some elected officials to visit our operation. When all the antennas had been taken down, the rigs stowed and the K-P duty finished, KM4D tallied up the points. The 5692 points this year is almost twice the 2007.

Having a GOTA (Get On The Air) station manned at all times by new Hams (KJ4BVM and KJ4DGT) and supervised by seasoned Hams, provided an extra 1600 points. GOTA only made 20 contacts but the station was on solar power and low transmitter power which added to the point value.

We had 744 CW contacts and 138 phone contacts on 5 frequency bands with 4 rigs. There were a total of 23 people on the log.

The club allotted \$250 to be used for food but our expenses were minimal thanks to the many donations of ice and beverages by members. Member of the Month Scott Thompson KI4HIE

Scott was born and raised in the Easton, Pennsylvania area. He attended Easton Area High School, Lehigh University and the University of the State of New York. He holds a degree in Electrical Engineering specializing in Electrical Power Distribution. After 31 years of service, he retired from Cooper Hand Tools, Weller Soldering Plant.

He became interested in Amateur Radio through co-workers Tommy Hyatt, KD4ZMR, and Rusty George, WD4HEM. Scott was originally licensed in April of 2000. He upgraded to Extra earlier this year which is his greatest amateur achievement so far. He is currently setting up an HF station.
