Marc spoke about the changes being made in the SC Section. Luckily, most appointees have agreed to stay in their positions. He relayed the ARRL's proposal to the FCC to change the wording of Part 97 "Communications in which the station licensee or control operator has a pecuniary interest, including communications on behalf of an employer, **except that the station licensee or control operator may, on behalf of an employer, participate in emergency preparedness and disaster drills that include Amateur operations for the purpose of emergency response, disaster relief or the testing and maintenance of**

equipment used for that purpose. Amateur operators may, however....." This would allow Amateurs who are employed in both public and private emergency organizations to participate in training exercises. He also reported that the ARRL plans to create an Emergency Communications Advisory Committee. KA3JAL, John Germain gave the following Treasurer's Report:
